Adult Amateurs: USDF/Dover Medal. **Minimum score of 60.000%.** US Equestrian Federation Amateur Card and USDF Group Membership or Participating Membership is required for this award. **Adult Amateur status as defined by USDF.**

Awards: High Point awards for: Purebred Arabian Open; HA/AA Open; Amateur to Ride (PB/HA/AA); PB/HA/AA Junior to Ride. USDF/Dover Medal in Dressage (see class list for test). High Percentage Dressage Ride, sponsored by Dah-Ban Arabians.

Food: Available on the grounds.

Camping fees: Without Hook-ups: \$30 per night. With Hook-ups: \$35 per night. Purchase permits at Show Office.

PREMIUMS: Ribbons through 6th place.

ENTRIES: BRING THE ORIGINAL COGGINS ON THE DAY OF THE SHOW!! Wisconsin requires a negative **COGGINS TEST**, dated within the current calendar year. Original report form or a health certificate with date of Coggins test must be presented prior to horse being unloaded at the show. Coggins must be legible. **The State of Wisconsin requires a health certificate for all horses entering the state.** For clarification, use horse's show name on the Coggins test and not his stable name. **Send photocopy with entry form.**

COPIES: Send copies of all association cards and certificates with your entry. Per USEF, you are now **required** to send a copy of your US Equestrian Federation or USCTA card with your entry. Please include a copy of both sides of registration papers with your entry.

Arabian owners/riders/handlers: If you are not a member of AHA, you will need to pay a single membership fee of \$35. Single membership is not applicable to regional classes.

Entry Fees: To be accepted, entries must be complete, correct and received by the closing date. Entries must be accompanied by full payment in order to be processed. An entry form is required for each horse/rider combination and an entry form must be completed and fees paid for every horse on the show grounds. Entries must be signed by the owner/agent, the trainer, and by all riders/handlers. **Juniors may not sign the entry form.** Exhibitors are responsible for their own errors and those of their agents in the preparation of entry blanks. Packets and exhibitor numbers will not be released until all entries are complete. Make checks payable to **WDHA**. Mail all entries to: Candy Ziebell, W322 S7777 Claire Dr., Mukwonago, WI 53149 (**Late entries may be permitted in Sport Horse classes after the deadline but no later than June 15, 2011, space/time permitting and payment of a late entry fee. Late fee is charged PER CLASS, in addition to the regular class fee. i.e. Class fee \$25 + \$10 late fee = \$35 for class**)

Refunds: Class entry fees will be given if written verification of unsoundness by a veterinarian is in possession of the Show Secretary **before the commencement of the show.** Stall fees and related show fees will not be refunded.

Arenas: 3 competition arenas (115' x 210', 115' x 210', 119' x 239') with sand footing. Grass warm up is available. Tests so approved by US Equestrian Federation may be held in a small arena.

Stabling: Stabling will be available **after 12:00 noon on Thursday, June 23, 2011.** All horses must have a stall. There will be no showing out of a trailer. Stalls are box stalls with fixed fronts. Anyone bringing a stallion is responsible for bringing suitable equipment to close off the stall, if necessary. Stabling requests will be honored, when possible, but are not guaranteed. Those making no requests will be considered as having no preference. **THERE IS TO BE NO SMOKING IN THE BARN.**

Bedding: No bedding is available on the grounds. Please bring your own or call Show Secretary for a local store to purchase bedding.

DOGS and OTHER ANIMALS: Please do **NOT** bring them. If you must, keep them on a **short leash** attached to a responsible adult.

EXHIBITORS: Entering a horse in classes differing by more than one level (dressage) is prohibited.

PROTECTIVE HEAD GEAR. Effective March 1, 2011: For Dressage, anyone mounted on a horse must wear protective headgear except those riders age 18 and over while on horses that are competing only in FEI levels and tests at the Prix St. Georges level and above (including FEI Young Rider Tests, the USEF Developing Prix St. Georges Test and the USEF Brentina Cup Test).

NSF CHECK POLICY. There will be a \$50 penalty each time a check is presented to our bank and returned due to insufficient funds. Violators will be reported to US Equestrian Federation. Guaranteed funds will be required of violators in the future.

RIDE TIMES: Ride times will be posted on the WDHA website, www.wdha.net, as well as emailed to a valid email address that is provided on the entry form no later than **FIVE (5) days prior to the start of the show.**

WARNING: Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities.

GR811 - Horse ID Number (HID): All horses competing in Federation licensed competitions (except those activities enumerated in GR1401.9, items 1-9) must be properly identified and must obtain a Horse ID Number from The Federation. An identification number for each horse must be entered on all entry forms for licensed competitions. Only one Horse ID Number will be issued per horse, and must remain with the horse throughout its career. Anyone knowingly applying for a duplicate Horse ID Number for an individual horse may be subject to disciplinary action. The Federation must be notified of any change of ownership and/or competition name of the horse. Owners are requested to notify the Federation of corrections to previously submitted information, e.g., names, addresses, breed registration, pedigree, or markings. (BOD 1/16/05 Effective 12/1/05)

1. Federation life recording numbers are the same as Horse ID Numbers.

2. Applications for Horse ID Numbers are available from the Federation office, and/or can be downloaded from the Federation website or from competition management. Competition management is responsible for notifying exhibitors of this requirement in their prize lists.

3. There will be no charge for Horse ID Numbers that are issued via the internet to members of USEF or its affiliates for: 1) horses that are life recorded, registered or otherwise identified or listed with a USEF discipline affiliate, or 2) horses registered with a USEF breed affiliate. Horses not meeting the above criteria must have a completed Horse Identification Form submitted with the application for a Horse ID Number before a number will be issued. Horse ID Numbers issued via mail will be charged \$10. (BOD 1/16/05 Effective 12/1/05)

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$30.00 NON-MEMBER REGISTRATION FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK-TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS. 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION; 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES.

Exhibitors: Please note that the classes may be combined for scheduling purposes but will be pinned separately, per division.

For example, the schedule may show Class 105 and Class 106 running together as Training Level Test 3. The scoreboard will show Class 105 Training Level Test 3 and Class 106 Training Level Test 3 ATR and will be scored separately.

USDF Dover Medal - Adult Amateur **per USEF definition – Open to both Arabian, Half-Arabian, Anglo-Arabian.
Minimum score of 60.000% needed. Rider must be a Participating Member or Group member of USDF.

* Sweepstakes points classes - Open to all Arabian, Half-Arabian, Anglo-Arabian horses, regardless of sweepstakes status.

Stick horses are available for use upon payment of a \$5.00 deposit. Deposit will be refunded upon return of stick horse.

~~ Exhibitors – Please note ~~

Please be sure to check out after your last class on Saturday afternoon. The Region 10 Championship classes are separate from the WDHA classes. Check-in for the Region 10 classes is expected to begin Saturday afternoon prior to the Region 10 Sport Horse Championship classes. Please see their pages for check in time at the show office.

~~ Exhibitors ... Did you know ... ~~

--- That if you place 1 - 6 in any Sport Horse class (In-hand or Under Saddle), you are qualified for your corresponding Regional Championship class?

--- That if you place 1 – 6 in any Dressage class or have two required scores (Training through Intermediate I), you are qualified for the corresponding Regional Championship class?

--- Due to the new point system that went into effect on January 1, 2005, exhibitors who place 1st through 6th receive points that may qualify them for the Regional Championships. A schedule of points needed for Regional/National qualification may be found in the AHA Handbook.

ATTENTION EXHIBITORS: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule

USDF / Dover Medal Class for Amateur Exhibitors

If you are entering the USDF/Dover Medal Class, please note the following: Anyone can enter the class, **BUT** you must be 22 years old or older as well as achieve a minimum score of **60.000%** to win this class. While USEF and AHA have different definitions of an Adult Amateur, USDF is the governing organization with regard to awarding the Dover Medal.

High Point Awards

The high point awards given at the show, Purebred Arabian Open, HA/AA Open, PB/HA/AA Junior to Ride and Amateur to Ride are given to the highest scoring ride in each of these categories. There will be no duplication of awards (i.e. highest JTR cannot win highest ATR or Open award). The High Percentage Dressage Ride sponsored by Dah-Ban Arabians will be awarded to the highest overall dressage score and **MAY** duplicate a previously given high point award. This is the only award that may possibly duplicate another award.

Back by popular demand ... Team Competition!!

Once again, we will be having a fun Team Competition along with our regular classes on Friday and Saturday. There is a small fee of **\$5.00 per person on each team** to enter and no special rides to do. You just ride your normal classes, and we do all the work! All entries for the Team Competition must be made before **NOON ON FRIDAY, JUNE 24, 2011**. They can also be sent with your show entry. If you do not have a team, but would like to be on one, please indicate this on your entry form and we can match you with someone who might need another member.

Here are your rules:

1. All teams must consist of three members – two (2) Dressage entrants **AND** one (1) Sport Horse In-hand/Under Saddle entrant **OR** one (1) Hunter/Jumper entrant. Team members can be juniors as well as adults. An entrant cannot use scores from two areas for one team. However, an entrant **MAY** be on two teams, competing in different areas on both teams. (i.e. Team 1 doing Dressage and Team 2 doing Sport Horse In-hand). Fees must be paid for both teams.
2. Dressage riders must ride two tests. These will be averaged together and that average used to figure final score.
3. Sport Horse In-hand/Under Saddle and Hunter/Jumpers need do only one class. The highest score/placing will be used.
4. The Dressage averages from the two riders will be added to the scores received in the Sport Horse and H/J classes to achieve a final score.
5. Final scores will be ranked highest to lowest and placed accordingly. Results will be announced Saturday after all team riders entered are finished and scores tabulated.
6. Name your team! Have fun and be creative with your names. Anything goes!

In consideration for AHA permitting me to participate in this Competition, and by signing the entry blank, I agree as follows:

I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in this Competition, as a rider, driver, handler, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, junior exhibitor, or as a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I AM FULLY AWARE AND ACKNOWLEDGE THAT HORSE SPORTS AND PARTICIPATION IN THIS COMPETITION INVOLVE SERIOUS RISK OF HARM INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, RISKS OF ACCIDENT, SERIOUS BODILY INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, BROKEN BONES, HEAD INJURIES, TRAUMA, PAIN, AND SUFFERING, AND PROPERTY DAMAGE. I ASSUME ALL RISKS OF HARM TO ME, MY HORSE OR MY PROPERTY.

I AGREE to indemnify and hold harmless (that is pay all losses, damages, attorneys fees and costs of) the Released Parties from and against any and all claims, demands, penalties, actions, losses, costs, damages, injuries, liabilities and obligations (including attorneys fees) of whatsoever kind and nature, which may be asserted against or incurred by any of them as a result of (1) my participation in the Competition or (2) any act, failure to act, or neglect (a) by me, my agents, employees, riders, handlers, trainers, coaches, drivers, contractors or invitees, or (b) by any animal owned or exhibited by me or in my custody or control.

I AGREE to accept AS FINAL any decision of AHA, the Show Commission or Show Officials concerning my qualification or the qualification of my horse to enter the Competition or any results of the Competition, except to the extent that the Rules of AHA, the Competition, Equine Canada or U.S. Equestrian Federation permit a protest or hearing of such decisions. Should a hearing be requested, I agree to accept AS FINAL the decision of the particular hearing body. I agree to release, hold harmless and not to sue AHA, the Competition Sponsor, their officers, directors, employees, volunteers or members concerning any decision of AHA, the Competition, its Show Commission, Show Officials or any hearing body that relates to my qualifications or my horse(s)' qualifications to enter the Competition or any results of the Competition.

I AGREE that AHA has the sole right to control, sell, supervise or give away (or assign to others the right to do so) the exclusive rights to broadcast, televise, reproduce, transmit and disseminate all or part of this event, and I agree that AHA may use or assign, in any way AHA sees fit, photographs, films, videos, audios, cablecasts, or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the Competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the Competition or AHA. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way which implies endorsement of any company, product, product category or service. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

By signing below as a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation and agree to all of the above provisions, and further agree to assume all of the obligations of this AHA Assumption of Risk, Release and Indemnification personally and on behalf of the child.

This AHA Assumption of Risk, Release and Indemnification is governed by the Laws of the State of Colorado and is intended to be interpreted as broadly as possible. I agree that exclusive jurisdiction and venue (place) for any legal action against AHA, its officers, directors, employees, volunteers or agents shall be in the local district courts or the federal court of the State of Colorado. If any part of this agreement is determined to be unenforceable, all other parts shall remain effect.

Federation Entry Agreement

I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Federation Release, Assumption of Risk, Waiver, and Indemnification

This document waives important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

I AGREE in consideration for my participation in this Competition to the following: I AGREE that "the Federation" and "Competition" as used herein includes the Licensee and Competition Management, as well as all of their officials, officers, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers and Federation affiliates.

I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in the Competition with my horse, as a rider, driver, handler, vaultor, longeur, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, or as parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. I am fully aware and acknowledge that horse sports and the Competition involve inherent dangerous risks of accident, loss, and serious bodily injury including broken bones, head injuries, trauma, pain, suffering, or death. ("Harm").

I AGREE to hold harmless and release the Federation and the Competition from all claims for money damages or otherwise for any Harm to me or my horse and for any Harm of any nature caused by me or my horse to others, even if the Harm arises or results, directly or indirectly, from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence of the Federation or the Competition.

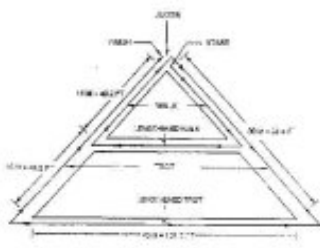

PROTECTIVE HEAD GEAR.

Effective March 1, 2011: For Dressage, anyone mounted on a horse must wear protective headgear except those riders age 18 and over while on horses that are competing only in FEI levels and tests at the Prix St. Georges level and above (including FEI Young Rider Tests, the USEF Developing Prix St. Georges Test and the USEF Brentina Cup Test).





USDF Membership Benefits: USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Competitor & Member Guide* or the USDF Web site at www.usdf.org.

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership, Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF NM fee. (Note: USDF business members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF BM.) Individuals cannot compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition with a USDF Education Membership.

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 90 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual/Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, Pas de Deux, Quadrille, FEI ParaEquestrian classes, are exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in headline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot, academy and opportunity classes. For foreign-owned horses competing in a CDI, USDF accepts copies of the horse identification pages from an FEI passport in lieu of a USDF HID or LHR number.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$75), 5-years (\$300), or life (\$1,500). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$60). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$200) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Education Membership (e-Membership): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. This online education only membership expires 12 months after the date joined. This membership type does NOT allow an individual to compete at a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$25 and a USDF NM form per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF member there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF Web site.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$25). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded, but will NOT be counted towards Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes or Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$70. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$95) is eligible for Adequan[®]/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Breeders' Championship Series Finals and Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF Web site: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form and fax or mail it to the USDF office.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date received by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 33,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

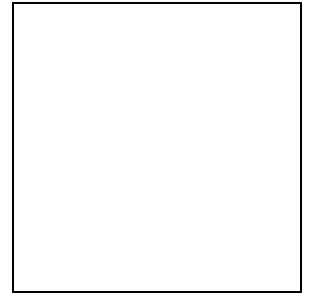
