BRIAN HUNT BENEFIT

Brian Hunt is a 30 year old Arabian enthusiast and local horse show judge. He has owned and shown Arabians most of his life, and is well-known in the community.

On July 4th, Brian was in a horrific car accident. He was riding a moped when he was hit by a car. He was med-flighted to a Milwaukee hospital, where he remains today. Although he is now in stable condition, Brian has suffered many injuries that will require months of therapy, including a traumatic brain injury.

Many people in the Arabian community have joined together to help Brian, and his horse Ghazi Go-Go, with the expected and unexpected expenses.

WDHA DRESSAGE & SPORT HORSE SHOW Submitted by Kristin Urban

The WDHA Dressage & Sport Horse Show can be termed a success for new manager Amy Thalacker in several respects. The show drew more entries than it has ever seen in this seventh year of existence....83 horses compared to 58 last year and

78 in 2006. It also showed a profit for the third time, a major accomplishment in this economically shaky time.

The show profit can be attributed to several factors: increased numbers, yes, though the increased cost necessitated by a second dressage judge and the expense of a second full-size dressage ring could have negated that. The show also dropped the over fences classes, which also eliminated the need for an ambulance on the grounds during the jumping sessions. Both the fences and the medical need added to the overall show cost in previous years.

The show this year did not mail out the prize list, but instead mailed postcards to Region 10 members letting them know that the prize list was available online, by snail mail only if necessary. Printing and mailing out the prize list to the entire Region 10 membership, even in bulk, can be a serious cost factor.

As more and more businesses are "going green," the printing and mailing of prize lists will probably become a thing of the past. In fact, many dressage shows have, for the past several years, made their prize lists available online only, and even have programs which allow entering the show online. Ride times for the show are also made available to email addresses....which the WDHA show has always done.

The last two major factors attributing to a good bottom line are the more equal distribution of facility costs to Region 10, which shares the facility on Saturday, but which gets the shared facility day gratis. The final factor has to do with Thalacker's efforts to solicit class sponsorships, frequently a "make or break" element in show profitability.

The weather was cooperative...hot on Friday, but better on Saturday and Sunday. The rain which threatened on Saturday fortunately did not occur until classes were complete.

Class numbers were especially encouraging in the in-hand classes, which have seen shockingly small numbers in the regular competition arena. The Under Saddle classes continued to draw large numbers, with 14 entries in HA/AA Sport Horse Under Saddle ATR and 14 entries in Arabian Sport Horse Under Saddle ATR as well.

The explosion in entries occurred in dressage, with 13 entries in Training Level Test 1, 17 entries in Training Level Test 1 ATR, 20 entries in Training Level Test 2, 16 entries in Training level Test 3 ATR, and 29 entries in Training Level Test 4. Even First Level saw good numbers, with 13 entries in the Test 4 slot.

Even the In-Hand classes saw goodly numbers, with 6 and 7 horses shown in the mares and geldings classes. We even saw four entries in Sport Horse Stallion In-Hand...a first!

Championship awards went to Heather Cochrane on KWM Force Hakim for the High Percentage Ride (72.368) and the Dah-Ban Arabians Perpetual Trophy honor; Purebred Arabian Champion was Muscatovich (71.600) ridden by Roberta Josephs; Half-Arabian Champion was Bblessed Union (72.000) ridden by Melinda Price; Champion Amateur Adult Rider was Stephanie Wilbur on Damascus DR (65.000); and Champion Junior Rider was Alaine Meese on Avatar MVP (69.565).

The Team Competition Gold Medals went to the Smarty Breeches (Suzette Sontag, Alaine Meese, and Stephanie Eckelkamp) with a combined score of 64.348. Silver Medals went to the Dressage Divas (Abby Weisenberger, Stephanie Eckelkamp, and Kate Wiggert-Johnson) with a combined score of 60.902. The Bronze Medal honors went to the Baysome Arabians (Julia Trone, Tracy Pierce, and Heather Cochrane) with a combined score of 55.328.

Thanks to Heidi Kohlbeck for sponsoring Taigers Friends: Mike Bernsdorf, June Scheunemann, and Meghan O'Connor, all from Equestrian Enterprises in Cato, WI, competed at the WDHA Dressage & Sport Horse Show for the first time.

First time exhibitors in the Sport Horse arena, Rachel Rhein and her mother Jill, were impressed with the more laid back atmosphere....and appreciative of the downplay on glitz and glitter. Jill said she could get used to "having fun" again. It didn't hurt that Rachel won both of her Sport Horse Show Hack qualifying classes, and went on to earn Region 10 championship honors in the same divisions.

Other WDHA regional winners included Annabeth and Stephanie Reitter, mother/daughter duo, who both earned Top Five honors in an Arabian Under Saddle class. Marta Roszak's Salute to Bask+ pulled another Top Five in Dressage Second Level; and Kristin Urban's stallion, A Bit of Flash, was named Region 10 Champion Sport Horse Stallion In-Hand.

WDHA member Tani Ketter was sporting a leg brace, but horses Dartagnan Noir and Berry Betrayed were ably showed by sister Nicole Trapp. Jan Wiggert and daughters Stephanie Eckelkamp and Kate Wiggert-Johnson again mopped up honors at both the WDHA show and the R10 championships with their two old campaigners, Priority Male+++ and Exceptional Result+/. And of course, they charmed everyone with their leadline exhibition, ridden by Devon Eckelkamp and Lyric Johnson.

Thanks, as always, go to the show's hard-working volunteers: Heidi Kohlbeck (ring steward, scribe), Michelle Peplinski (ring steward), Jackie Luebke-Puetz (scribe), Paula Roberts (scribe), Don Borth (gate, runner, ribbon presentation), and Mary and John Adleman (scorers). Thanks go to Candy Ziebell (ride times and dressage ring acquisition). Thanks, also, to Jill and Rachel Rhein and Team Sharer for assistance in setting up the second dressage ring and the in-hand ring. The show couldn't function with all that "many hands make light work" ethic. Technical Delegate Marjorie Malkin again gave the show management top marks for a well-run show.

Manager Thalacker is already moving forward with plans for the 2010 show with approval applications and championship trophy purchase. Once again, the need for additional scribes, steward, and scorers underlines the need for additional volunteer training. Thalacker plans some educational experiences and "job shadowing" opportunities for people interested in becoming involved in these increasingly popular divisions.

Because the show has grown so much, there is talk of separating it from the R10 Dressage Championships. People interested in the future of the Sport Horse and Dressage divisions should contact Thalacker with their input.

OPEN EVENT INCENTIVE PROGRAM

The Open Event Incentive Program rewards both Riders and Horses that excel in all-breed competitions outside of the traditional Arabian horse community. As a participant in OEIP, you and your horse will accumulate points based on how you place in competitions and be rewarded for all of your achievements and hard work.

Riders who participate in OEIP will earn recognition and awards based on the number of points they accumulate. In addition, the horses used in these competitions will automatically have their accomplishments recorded in their permanent event record in the Arabian Horse DataSource world database.

Horse owners that do not compete as the rider may also join the program and enter horses they own without the rider being part of the program.

NOTE: Participation in any Arabian Horse Association program requires a current membership with the Arabian Horse Association.

REWARDS

The Open Event Incentive Program rewards riders and Arabian horses that compete in OEIP events with the following awards and recognition:

OEIP Horses - OEIP recognizes the success of individual Arabian, Half-Arabian and Anglo-Arabian horses in OEIP events by recording accomplishments in each horse's permanent event record in the Arabian Horse Association's Arabian DataSource.

OEIP Competitors - After reaching each major point milestone, OEIP participants will receive a Lapel Pin identifying their achievement level. Milestones are reached at 10, 20, 60, 100, 250, 350, 500, 750, 1000 points.

High Point Achievers - The annual High Point Achiever from each event category (for both national and local event divisions) will receive a trophy at the end of each calendar year, plus photo recognition on the AHA website.

NOTE: Competitors must reach at least 10 points in a category to qualify for the annual high point award. Awards are based on points earned between January 1 and December 31 of that year.

RECOGNIZED EVENTS

OEIP accepts most types of events. The following criteria apply to events and hosting organizations:

- The event must be approved by a national or local organization that keeps an official performance record for each horse entered in the event.
- The host organization must have an established governing body.
- The host organization must have a show manager at the event who will sign the Event Report Form presented by the exhibitor/competitor.

• The host organization must also maintain permanent event records at a central location for at least one year where event participation can be verified.

The following categories are currently approved for all-breed competitions hosted by national organizations:

- Barrel • Combined Driving • Competitive Mounted Orienteering • Eventing
- Competitive Trail Riding • Mounted Shooting
- Cutting • Dressage • Driving • Endurance
- Reining • Ride and Tie • Roping • Sidesaddle
- Stadium Jumping • Team Penning • Vaulting
- Working Cow Horse

The following categories are currently approved for all-breed competitions hosted by Local Organizations and 4-H:

- Halter • Hunter Equitation • Hunter Pleasure/Hunter Hack • Leadline
- Miscellaneous (native costume, liberty, combination, most classic, sidesaddle)
- Saddleseat Equitation • Saddleseat Pleasure (English, Park Horse, Country English)
- Show Hack • Showmanship • Stock Horse
- Trail • Walk-Trot • Western horsemanship/Riding/Equitation
- Western Pleasure/Bareback Pleasure (Specialty Performance Categories - Local Open Shows)
- Cutting • Dressage • Driving • Jumping
- Gaming/Gymkhana • Reining • Roping
- Team Penning

POINTS

Points are calculated automatically based on event placement and other criteria. You can review the calculations for different events/classes by using the OEIP Point Calculator on the AHA website.

Riders can accumulate points in a category, regardless of which Arabian horses they ride (as long as it is a registered Arabian, Half-Arabian or Anglo-Arabian.) In the same way, horses can earn and accumulate points in a given category regardless of who the rider is.

Since all of the Incentive Programs are online, you will enter your accomplishments directly in the online OEIP Log after you participate in an event. Next, turn in the completed Event Report Form within 60 days, signed by the event manager. As soon as you enter the event information in the online OEIP Log and the Arabian Horse Association has verified it against the completed Event Report Form, points will be recorded and calculated toward the annual High Point Category.

Event results must be entered and the Event Report Form returned along with the processing fee within 60 days following the event date in order for the results to be accepted (December events have a 30 day deadline to expedite High Point calculations). During that time the event results will remain pending until AHA receives your signed Event Report Form and the \$3.00 online processing fee per event--that's per event, not per class!
